

Brixton bomber may strike again, warns anti-terrorist police chief

POLICE staged a reconstruction of the Brixton bombing yesterday – and warned that the maniac who did it may strike again.

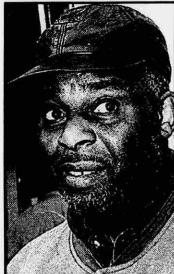
Anti-terrorist Squad chief Alan Fry placed a replica of the Head sports bag which concealed the nail bomb that injured 39 people at the bus stop where it went off.

And he warned: "I cannot rule out another attack."

"That possibility haunts me and the other 27,000 Metropolitan police officers."

Appealing for new witnesses to step forward he said as he placed the bag: "Someone could have been here in this street and seen this bag being carried."

"Or someone could

have seen it when they were somewhere else."

The hunt is still focusing on right-wing terror groups.

Scotland Yard is offering a £25,000 reward for information leading to the capture of the bomber.

Murdered schoolboy

Stephen Lawrence's father Neville was at the market earlier handing out police posters appealing for help in catching the bomber.

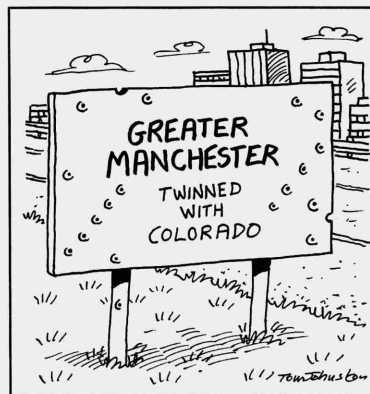
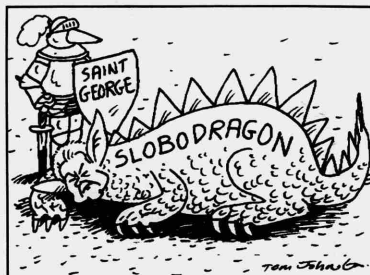
An FBI expert who helped compile a psychological profile of the Unabomber believes the Brixton bomber will certainly strike again.

Dr Richard Ault, a real-life Cracker who served 18 years in the FBI, believes the bomber will develop a taste for this type of terrorism.

HUNDREDS of people yesterday took part in a march past the place where teacher Blair Peach, 33, died 20 years ago.

He was killed as police tried to disperse thousands of demonstrators protesting against a National front rally in Southall, West London.

LORDS TARGET OF RACE HATE DEATH THREATS

Police send letters for DNA tests

RACIST fanatics have sent death threats through the post to black, Asian and Jewish peers.

Detectives from Scotland Yard have been called in to probe the vile letters sent to all 12 black and Asian peers and every Jewish Lord. Police have sent some of the letters for DNA testing after fearful peers called them in.

But Lord Taylor of Warwick, Britain's first black peer, said last night: "I won't be intimidated by this kind of nonsense. If anything, it makes me more determined to fight racism."

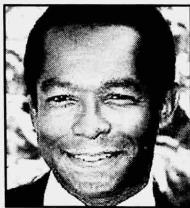
The vicious hate campaign was launched just days after the nail bomb attack in London's ethnic district of Brixton which put 39 people in hospital.

The ultra right wing racist group Combat 18 claimed responsibility for the attack.

One of the latest death threats, addressed to Baroness Flather at her

home in Berkshire, brought back terrible memories of a brutal race attack in the 1980s.

Her husband Gary said last night: "Asian and black peers have been told that they will be done away with or something like that."

"We had a racial attack here at home in 1983. A 16in long steel arrow was

fired from a crossbow through the window at me and one of my sons.

"Outside on the gatepost was sprayed in black 'a racial traitor lives here'."

"Because I am white they thought I was a traitor for marrying an Asian. I chased after one man but he got away."

He added that Baroness Flather, 65, who was the first Asian peer to sit in the Lords, was trying not to let the threats worry her.

Lord Taylor revealed that the letters had been sent out by a racist organisation calling themselves the Command Council of White Wolves.

He said: "The letters say that the black Parliamentarians must leave Britain by the end of the year."

Lord Meghnad Desai said he had been offered police security after receiving a death threat but had turned it down.

He got a badly printed message at his House of Lords office days before the Brixton bomb.

"I gave it to the House of Lords security staff and I didn't think about it any further. But when the Brixton bomb went off I thought these may be the people behind the bomb."
